The Secretary of Education of the state of Nuevo Leon, Reyes Tamez Guerra, noted that the objective of the International Forum on Reflections on the Great Challenges of Education, Democracy and Development is to generate policies that improve education.

“This meeting is aimed at the challenges which face countries in order to resolve situations which come up under the headings of development and democracy,” he clarified.

Yesterday the conference’s opening speech was delivered by the former Secretary of Education of the United States, Rod Paige, who, during his time as secretary, opened public schools for children of Mexican migrants.

Speakers scheduled for Tuesday include Guilles Bataillon of the School for Advanced Studies in the Social Sciences (EHESS) in Paris; Antonio Navalón Sánchez, Mexican historian, writer and journalist; the former secretary of Education of Mexico, Miguel Limón Rojas; and the former Minister of Foreign Relations of Mexico, Jorge Castañeda, as well as Reyes S. Tamez Guerra.
